**1. FIRST IMPRESSIONS**

The vacation wow-factor begins the moment the elevator doors open and guests step into a private foyer with a silver-leaf ceiling, double-glass doors and museum-quality art. That black-and-white pattern on the marble flooring signals glamorous things to come.

2. TAKE A SEAT

Colors pop in the living room, thanks to accent pieces, abstract canvases and a large area rug. Dark grays and neutrals dominate the palette as far as furniture is concerned. That is indeed a working fireplace framed in white stone underneath a 56-inch HD LCD TV set.

3. BON APPÉTIT

In-room meals are always formal in the 10-person dining room, which features two crystal chandeliers, crystal sconces, flora-themed art and a wood dining table surrounded by zebra-print chairs atop a coral pony-hair rug. Needless to say, minimalism is not on the menu.

4. SWEET DREAMS
